There have been numerous meetings since June with local city & county representatives, Metropolitan Planning Organizations, Economic and Community Development, environmental groups, industry and the public. The EAC process has provided an opportunity for local governments and everyone involved to participate in achieving the 8-hour ozone standard in their area.

The following control measures are being considered, and are anticipated to apply across the State of Tennessee: more stringent controls for open burning, rules for idling and smoking vehicles, a NOx RACT rule, and anti-tampering rules for vehicles. The geographical areas in which other local control measures will apply are identified in the EAC documentation. The likely implementation date for the statewide and local control measures under consideration is anticipated to be prior to the 2005 ozone season. Review the EAC documentation for each area to find more specific detailed information.
