EARLY ACTION COMPACT PROGRESS REPORT SUMMARY

State and local governments are pursuing early Action Compact (EAC) participation in each of the seven compact areas. Local Air Programs, Metropolitan Planning Organizations as well as many other organizations, committees, industries and environmental groups are all working together to discover what control measures will work best in their area to achieve voluntary attainment of the 8-hour ozone standard. The work that has been done so far regarding outreach has made a tremendous difference in awareness at both City/County levels and with the general public.

Each EAC area in Tennessee submitted a list of likely control measures June 12, 2003 to the Environmental Protection Agency for consideration as a means to achieve attainment. The following information is included to show what progress has been made, which is substantial, and to meet the June 30th milestone:
